# ***Macomb Television Show Receives Two Emmy Awards***

MT. CLEMENS - Macomb County's only representatives at the Michigan Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Emmy Awards walked away with two of the prestigious winged statuette that symbolizes the arts and science of television.

The Macomb County Bar Association and its partner Sterling Heights Television produce the television show Legally Speaking. Funded by a grant from the Macomb County Bar Foundation, Legally Speaking is a television show that educates the public on law related matters. With its first Emmy Award in 2006 and the two received at the June 15, 2007 event at the Gem Theatre, the show continues to deliver on its promise.

Sterling Heights Television Production Specialist Matthew Phillips and host of the show, Macomb attorney Charlie Langton received nominations in the categories of:

- Segment category: public current community affairs feature segment category

Mr. Phillips and Mr. Langton's work on the Legally Speaking episode featuring Attorney General Mike Cox won out over the "The Race for Governor" with WKAR's Tim Skubick and WDIV's "Flashpoint" with host Devin Scillian. Legally Speaking's second Emmy award of the evening was awarded in the Public/Current Events/Community Affairs.
